



Steve We wanted a wide range of our.....kind of cross section of our material and um, it

was a collaborative approach to choosing songs and uh, we just felt that they

showed us in all our different......facets.

OUCH!!! both facets?.....

SteveFrom shit to bad.....LFMK giggling.

OUCH!!! Okay, um, what was I gonna ask ya.....LFMK laughing.....so what do you see

your position in the band as?......

SteveMe?.....

OUCH!!! Apart from the obvious, bass player.

Steve Um, I don't know. I think I'm the great mediator. Whenever there's a conflict I

always have to calm everybody down.

OUCH!!!You're the luke warm water......

Steve Like, Nick'll be pissed off about something and he'll say "oh, what the hell's going on about this" and I'll calm him down and then Chris'll say something about the

same sort of thing......I Am Switzerland! Everybody Laughing

OUCH!!! I notice a lot of production on these songs has made the songs a lot different to the

way they're being played live. Like, I notice For Once, one of my favourites songs, sounds very different on CD than I'd ever heard it live before. Is that because you

went in there and you had these new toys?.....

Steve Yeah, basically....when Chris wasn't in the studio me and Ben went to town.....

Everybody Chuckles......that particular track, For Once, the bass soundwe were listening to Red Hot Chilli Peppers Album and we wanted to try and get that sound that's on the last track on that I Think. It took us about an hour to get it, we hooked it through a wah and through a distortion pedal....came up with something fairly

close though....it was good fun stuffing around with things like that....

OUCH!!! So you think it was all worth while.....

Steve Yeah, now we've just gotta find out a way to do it live....

OUCH!!! Okay, where have you played lately?

Steve Um,....we played a gig down at Dunsborough and uh, they were pretty,..well,

apparently they were pretty happy with that because they've asked us back. Apart

from that we've been keeping a pretty low profile up to the launch.

OUCH!!! Where did the idea for 'Coffee' come from?

Steve Interesting question, that. Nick actually came up with this song called 'Coffee'.

Well, apparently he did, we've never seen it.

Chris Yes we have! Steve Have we?

Chris Yeah, we've seen the lyrics.

Steve Oh, alright, OK......and um, we thought if we can get that song ready, Coffee

would be a good a name for the CD, but we couldn't so we thought, well, we might

as well call it Coffee anyway.

OUCH!!! So the next CD will have Coffee on it?

Steve Yep, probably.....

OUCH!!! But of course it won't be called Coffee ...

Steve Unless we call it Coffee 2 or Cappuccino or something......

F.U.L.L. : COFFEE

I've been waiting for the opportunity to review LFMK's CD for quite some time now, and after his sarcastic comments about my bands delayed CD release on 100fm I should cane the band. But it's evident from the start that COFFEE is a CD from a great band not content to find a 'niche'. Knowing what I do of F.U.L.L., it didn't surprise me to find fretwork and rhythm that are the signs of continual experimentation from the guys. F.U.L.L. don't have a dazzling vocal department, but when the instrumentation and arrangements are considered, such vocals would probably be superfluous anyway. There is a great 'live' sound to the CD, balanced with some effective use of studio 'toys' (refer interview page 6). What ? opens the CD with some chunky hard funk riffing, setting the pace for what is to come. A nice double tracked vocal in the chorus and some effective guitar harmonics provide some of the highlights. The second track is actually the intro to Turn Away, with track 3 being the main body of this more commercial song. Live In The Now follows on with great use of background feedback in the chorus and some hardhitting drums once again bolstered with thick riffing. Slow Heavy Frank is my second favourite track on the disc, with one of the best bass intros I've heard since Tears by Keith Anthony. The eastern sounds quickly call to mind bands like THE TEA PARTY, only without actually using all the eastern instruments of the latter band. A plodding, brooding song punctuated with a great tension building chorus and solo, it is sure to win the band many new fans. End In Tears is a song I hadn't heard before this CD and I must admit it did seem to be a bit of an odd track out stylistically. The rhythmical and vocal delivery in this track are reminiscent of some past mainstream songs and as such were a bit unexpected, but they nonetheless show another side to the F.U.L.L. machine. For Once is the closer for COFFEE, a song which has been a long time favourite of mine from this band. It's aggressive, chugging, in-your-face delivery is something I personally love, with good tempo building throughout the song. The song did seem to get a heavy dose of that "studio-toy" working, most noticeably on the bass guitar (RED HOT CHILLI PEPPERS will come to mind), which slightly reduces the impact from that of the live version, but it'll still be the one I select when I get sick of listening to the others, which should be quite a while yet

SIMON NALBERSKI: HAEMORRHAGE

If you're a budding guitarist or an accomplished musician whose looking at \$70 to \$80 videos of the 'stars' to give you new ideas, maybe you might like to consider a far less expensive alternative. HAEMORRHAGE by SIMON NALBERSKI is a collection of twelve instrumental guitar tracks, packed with some great riffs and fretwork. His command of the wammy bar is nothing short of awesome, evident from the opening track, This Is Not The Machine Part 1, with it's great flicked-bar intro. Also on the point of whammy bar technique, check out the screaming pitch-raising sections in Stained and Gurnged. If it's harmonised guitar you love, you can't go past Rest(Art). The CD is packed with syncopation, almost so that it would be nice to here more mainstream rhythmical ideas occassionally, but there is no denying that this is a must for anyone who loves great instrumental guitar music or anyone looking for inspiration with their music.

the CHRISOF DEATH

iNFECTED: TRIAL

Favouring a more machine-like approach than previous efforts, INFECTED's latest offering is enough to convert any new listener into an instant fan. Three tracks, all expertly performed exemplify exactly why INFECTED are amongst Perth's finest heavy bands. Hatecrime features a wicked keyboard sound and some cool melodies and Brick Wall View has plenty to offer in terms of aggression and variety but the standout track in my opinion is Disown featuring some excellent delayed vocal sounds. Drummer Gareth Morris holds everything together brilliantly without ever going for an obvious rhythm but everyone in INFECTED gets some limelight on TRIAL without going over the top. Check this one out and if you like it grab CRAWLSPACE and CONTROL too. You won't be disappointed.

ATMOSFEAR: STASH (VIDEO)

After witnessing a fantastic video launch at the Newport which saw the boys in ATMOSFEAR deliver an unbelievable set, it only seems right to review their STASH video, a collection of four clips, all songs featured on the STASH CD. The video opens with Chemical Reaction featuring the band in eerie clown make-up and various distressing news footage. It is very effective and very well directed. Next up is Mouth, this song accompanied by a tamer video, but nonetheless a visually pleasing excursion. Terra Firma and Stash are basically live videos containing some interesting footage from Big Day Out '96. The video ends with a montage credit sequence to the song Down, one of my personal favourites. For the budget this video was done on, it is a very interesting and slick looking watch. Another triumph for ATMOSFEAR.


